

PRIORITY CALL GUIDELINES

Critical
(priority 1)

- Cardiac Arrest
 - Acute Pulmonary Edema
 - Unstable Cardiac
 - Respiratory Arrest
 - Unstable Vital Signs
 - STEMI Alert
 - Stroke Alert
- **Examples**
- Airway Obstruction
 - Anaphylaxis unstable
 - GI Bleed -unstable
 - Severe Burns
 - Unconscious Patient
 - Trauma with unstable vitals of GCS < 14

Urgent
(priority 2)

- Suspected Cardiac
 - ACS Consults
 - Sepsis Alert
 - Multiple Trauma
- **Examples**
- Transient LOC (unk etiology)
 - Suspected fx's/dislocations
 - Unstable Behavioral Patients
 - Moderate Burns

Stable
(priority 3)

- Stable Trauma
 - Minor Lacs/Soft Tissue injuries
 - Stable Behavioral Health Patients
 - Non-Acute Medical Complaints
- **Examples**
- Suspected Minor Fx's
 - Minor Burns
